

Summer Math

Dear Parents,

Next fall, your child will take a timed test during the first week of school in September. Over the summer, he should continue to practice the appropriate math facts for speed and accuracy. Using fingers or hesitating is not considered mastery.

- Students entering *second grade* should master all addition and subtraction facts to 10.
- Students entering *third grade* should master all addition and subtraction facts to 20.
- Students entering *fourth grade* should master all multiplication facts from 0 – 10.
- Students entering *fifth grade* should master all multiplication and division facts from 0 – 10.

Here are some helpful hints:

- Make or buy flashcards
- Orally quiz your child whenever you are in the car.
- Create a daily practice test and time your child. He should be able to complete 50 facts in 2 ½ minutes.
